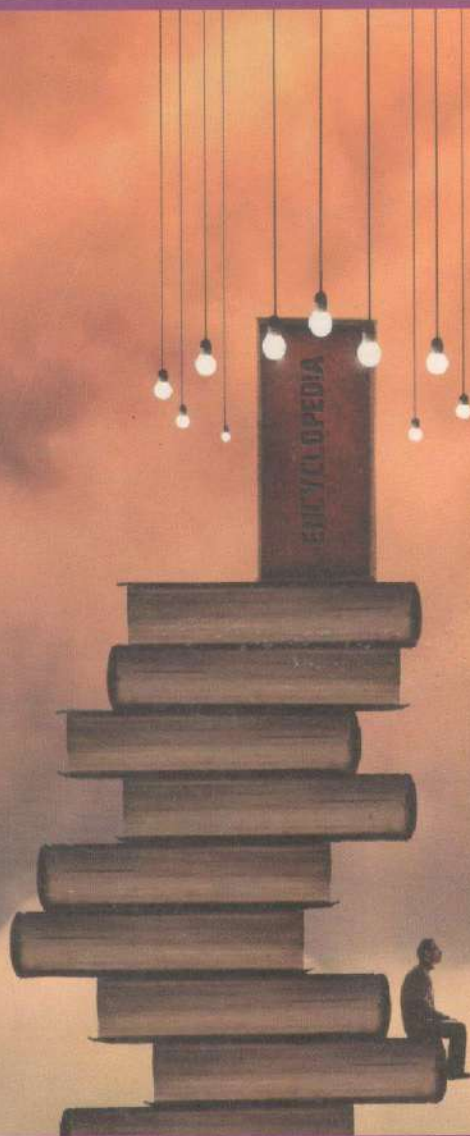

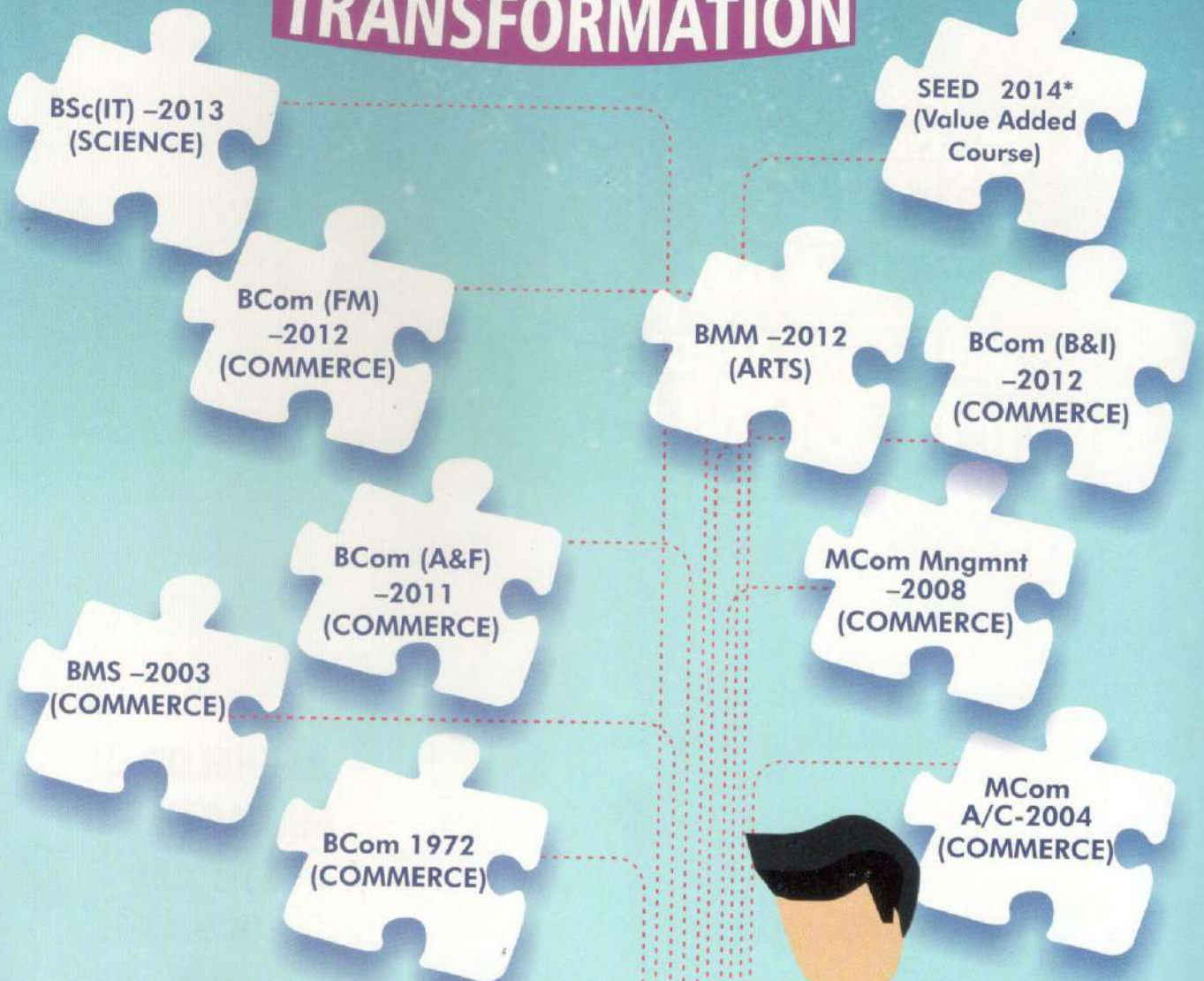

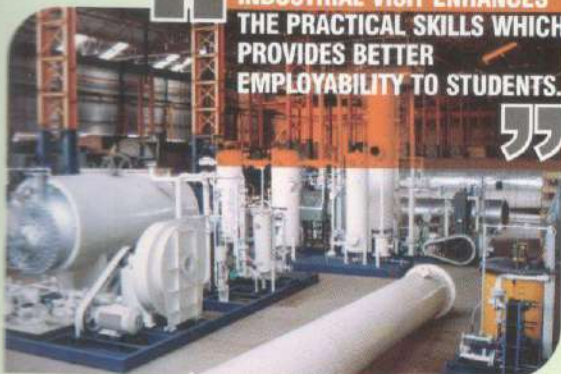

It is my proud privilege to put before you the achievements and happenings of this academic year. Our students have been scaling new heights in every field. The academic performance of our students is excellent.

Our BCom Degree passing percentage is 91.29. Of the 620 students who appeared for the examinations 566 were declared successful, with 81 obtaining the 'O' Grade, 134 students with 'A' Grade and 161 and 140 students obtaining the 'B' and 'C' Grade respectively. Paliwal Jitendra Nandki topped the class.

The BMS Degree passing percentage is 45.56. Patel Gautam A. topped the class. The BAF Degree passing percentage is 98.27. Gautami Acharya topped the class. The BBI Degree passing percentage is 100. Shah Ruchir topped the class. The BFM Degree passing percentage is 60. Mehta Neha Rajendra topped the class. The BMM Degree passing percentage is 87.5. Sharma Ashish Satish Menka topped the class. The MCom-II (Accountancy) passing percentage is 77.63 and Kandu Keval topped the class. The MCom (Management) passing percentage is 76 and Bansal Nehrani topped the class. All these achievements were possible because of the commitment of all concerned, the Principal, the Management, Teaching and Non-Teaching Staff and the Students.

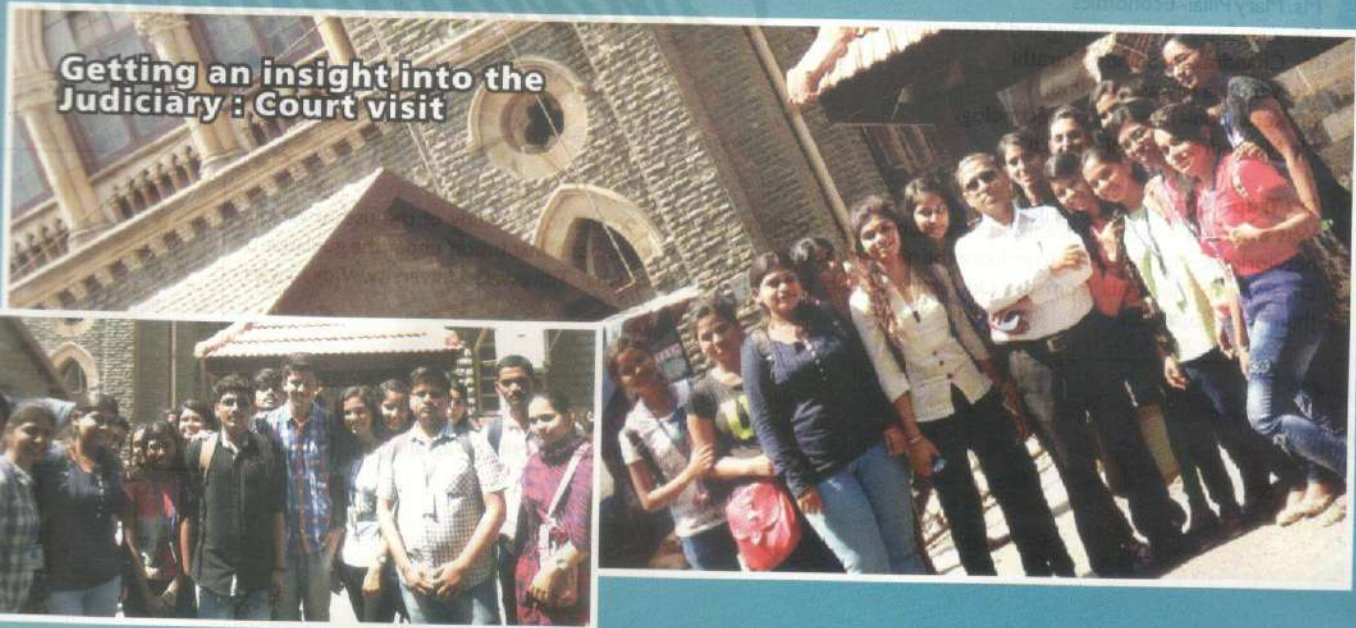

Court visit

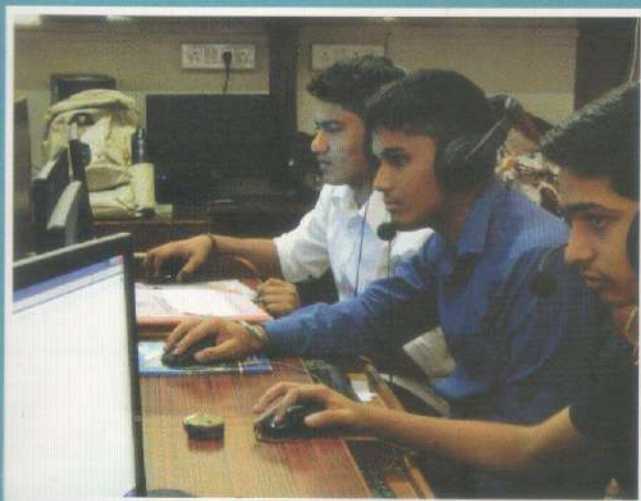
Forty Five students of Prahladrai Dalmia Lions College of Commerce and Economics were taken for a visit to the Mumbai High Court on 26th February.

Academic Activities:

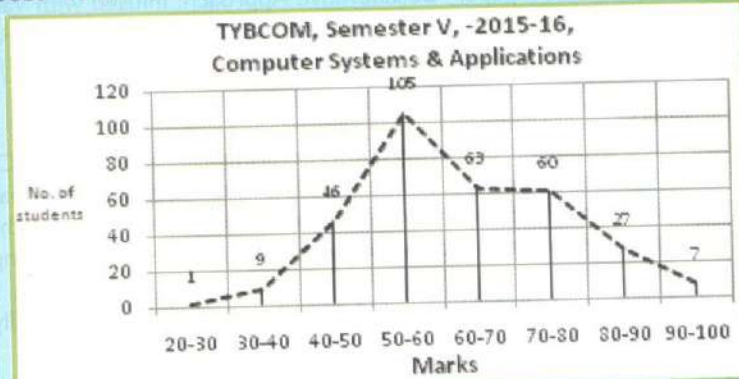
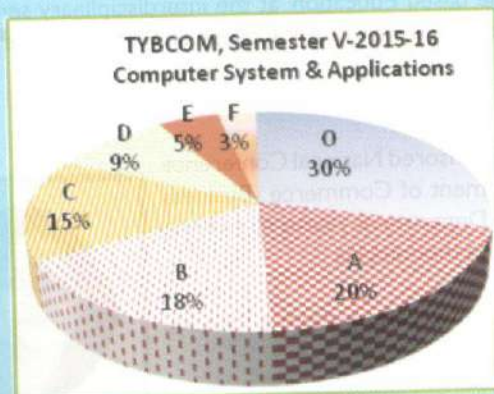

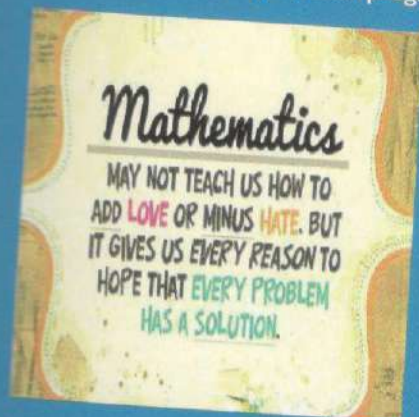

Guest lecture:

We all know that there is huge influence of internet on our daily life. It has brought the world closer and at the same time made it a smaller place to live in for all internet users. Undoubtedly it has changed our lives enormously so much so that it is "THE" medium of the future. However the internet users who spend long hours on cyber space face another problem called cybercrime.

Cybercrime commonly includes Hacking, Theft, Cyber Stalking, Identity Theft, Malicious Software and many more.

While law enforcement agencies are trying to tackle this problem, it is growing steadily and many people have become victims of these cybercrimes and cyber-attacks. One of the best ways to avoid being a victim of cybercrimes and protecting our sensitive information is by making use of impenetrable security that uses a unified system of software and hardware to authenticate any information that is sent or accessed over the Internet. Therefore we thought that it would be necessary to be aware about some good and bad aspects of this medium, how to safeguard ourselves in cyber space and how to minimize cyber vulnerability. To enlighten all of us on these issues and many others, we had invited an eminent lawyer, specialist in dealing with cybercrimes and cyber laws Adv. Pankaj Bafna elaborated on the following points in the seminar:

- Keeping a password lock in mobile phone doesn't protect it from hackers
- Downloading free apps in mobile may lead to criminals viewing our personal database
- Criminals may find our IMEI code using our mobile numbers and use that code for criminal activities
- Explained about cyberstalking with an example of 2013 case of famous actor Shruti Hasan

- Explained that if our mobile is lost and found easily then first thing we must do is to lodge a complaint with SSKA
- Forming a WhatsApp group and adding people in the group without their prior permission is an offence.
- Legal notice in the form of a message or email is also valid
- Viewing or sending pornography is a criminal act
- Never respond to messages offering rewards of money
- Music directors copyright their songs. So downloading free songs from unauthorized sites is also an offence. Eg: www.songs.pk.com
- Mentioned about killing a person using a song sent through WhatsApp.
- Songs should never be downloaded for free
- Criminals involved in Cybercrime are mostly aged between 12 to 16 years, as they have a creative mind
- Children aged below 16 yrs cannot have an account on social networking websites.
- Shopping websites such as amazon.com, eBay.com do not have any security system for our personal data
- Never allow anyone to scan credit cards especially, backside (in malls). This may be used by criminals to duplicate the card
- Keep a watch on our mobiles whether it is cloned or not. Criminals clone our mobiles using data obtained from service centers.
- Never use free sim cards.

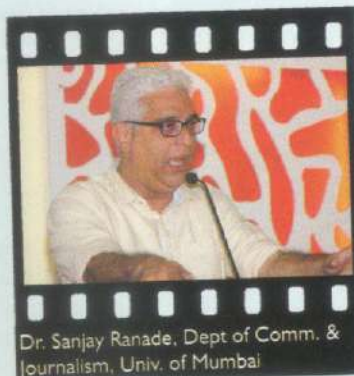

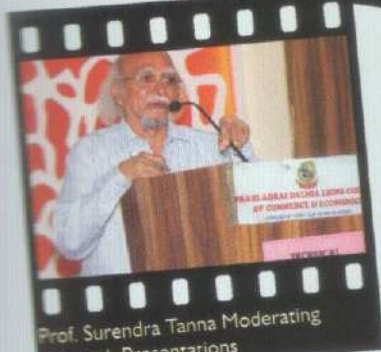

Rural households are the most heavily burdened by the consequences of poverty and hunger. In addition to causing hunger, poverty limits a rural community's ability to invest in its own development. Recognizing the urgency of this issue, our college decided to take a step towards uplifting the status of the marginalized in its own small way. On the recommendation of Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), DLLE, NSS, NCC and Students' Council conducted **A One Day Mega Medical Check – Up and Distribution Campaign at a tribal village named Osarvira in Palghar District** nearly 102 kms from Mumbai on Wednesday, 2nd February, along with 40 committed student volunteers and 11 teachers. This campaign had twin objectives – i) To enable students understand the socio-economic realities of the under-privileged ii) To train students to grow up as responsible citizens without a self-centered worldview.

A glimpse of activities conducted

Distribution of Clothes, Stationary, toys, utensils and food items:

To take is the nature of animals. To give and take is the nature of human beings. To give without taking is the nature of the Divine. Through giving, we grow in divinity. Kept to ourselves, our happiness will become stagnant and fade away. To increase our joy we must share joy with others. Giving is essential for spiritual growth. A willingness to share what we have and to help others is called seva.

Seva is our own inner joy pouring forth into action. It is not a compulsion, duty or uncomfortable obligation, but instead a natural state of mind that is poised to offer what is needed according to time, place and situation. Seva connects us to others and makes them a part of us. The barriers dissolve that separate our happiness from their happiness. Lingering moods of unhappiness or depression dissipate when our focus is on helping someone else. We come to realize that the true measure of our lives is not how much we have gained for ourselves, but how much we have given to others.

We can serve others in endless ways by using our own creativity and imagination. When one looks for opportunities, it is easy to locate small ways to help even amidst busy daily routines. Around 300 Zilla Parishad school children from standard I to VII were distributed notebooks, pens, pencils, erasers, toys and writing pads. 250 tribal women, men, children were distributed clothes which were collected from teachers and students of our college. IQAC would especially like to acknowledge the DLLE students who donated the entire profit that they made during the Business Fair organized by Department of BMS.

Medical Camp:

The camp lasted throughout the day. Around 500 patients were treated. The college roped in services of two doctors - Dr. Rajesh Bombe and Dr. Pravalit Sonkamble to conduct this activity in a smooth manner.

Women primarily suffered from backache as they had to fetch water from long distance. The men were found to be suffering with health issues related to heavy drinking. Most of the children suffered from severe problem of scabies. Students were given ointments, soaps and medicines free of cost. A demonstration on "How to wash hands" was given by our teachers to signify the importance of cleanliness and personal hygiene.

All the patients were given free general medicines and those who were found to be having larger health issues were advised to visit the general hospital at the earliest.

Donations of Spiritual Books:

Education becomes holistic when spirituality becomes the epicenter of knowledge transmission. Keeping this in mind, our teachers donated spiritual books like- *Bhimrupi Stotra*, *Vidhyartyanche Ramdas* and *Yuvakacha Sfurti Nirzar* by Samarth Ramdas to school children.

Donation of Footwear to School Children:

Things that we consider as 'normal' are beyond reach of many.... Things as simple as footwear.... which appears trivial... But is very important... Let us try walking on burning roads in the heat, or dusty terrains with thorns... We will not be able to sustain. Such is the pain that the deprived undergo and such is the terrible nature of their hardships. Their paths are laden with pain. A footwear is a source of great solace to their feet and minds. Let us not belittle its importance.... It makes a journey that much more bearable and enjoyable for so many, especially school kids.... There are city dwellers that would spend so much on pedicure and foot massages and there are some whose feet have endured heat, thorns and infections. Footwear is a first significant step in that healing.....

After realizing these hardships faced by school children from a pre-camp survey, our teachers decided to donate footwear to 300 school children of three Zilla Parishad Schools.

This step was highly appreciated by the school authorities and the smiling faces of the children drenched the souls of teachers with a sense of fulfillment.

Survey:

In order to instill research qualities among the college students, we decided to conduct a health survey to ascertain the health status of the school children and the villagers. A Questionnaire was prepared and few college students were entrusted the responsibility of gathering data. They gathered valuable information on height and weight of the respondents. This data can be a rich source of information to identify the level of malnutrition among the tribal adults and children. Data on other parameters of health such as BP and Diabetes was also collected, but surprisingly of the 500 respondents checked, only 1 % had these life style diseases.

Community Service Project at Damu Nagar: an Initiative of the Disaster Management Cell

Mon, 7 December 2015 – a major fire broke out in a godown in Kandivali East in Mumbai. Multiple gas cylinder explosions coupled with gusty winds led to about 2,000 shanties being burnt to the ground hours in this huge fire broke that broke out at the Damu Nagar slum in Kandivali (East) on the fated Monday. The massive fire claimed two lives and rendered thousands homeless.

The Disaster Management Cell of our college immediately swung into action as the news spread through mobile and other social networking sites. The team rushed to the site on 9th December and rendered aid to those affected. The team along with Prof. Rajesh Ruke, Dr. Kiran Mane, Prof. Shami Nimgulkar-Kamble, Prof. Sachin Bansode and Prof. Rajesh Bombe visited the spot and distributed 100 vadapavs to a section of the people affected by the tragedy.

The call for assistance by the team reached out to the student and teaching fraternity. They responded by donating utensils and clothing to the affected people. On 15th December the disaster management team along with NSS volunteers and Students' Council visited Damu Nagar and distributed six bags of clothing and three bags of utensils to more than 100 affected people. Though the aid rendered may be miniscule in its affect, the fact remains that the efforts put forth by our students got them sensitised to the problems of others and taught them to respond to the needy in distress.

A survey was conducted by our students with the help of our teachers with regards to the help required by the people affected by the fire. The interviews and survey revealed that their shanties being burnt, they required tarpaulins to build them up again. They were receiving aid from neighbouring people and political leaders in other ways but they required their shelter to be rebuilt even if they were temporary. So after discussion a total of Rs. 19,000/- was collected and on 22nd December 125 tarpaulins (10x10 = 100 sq.ft. each i.e. 12500 /- sq.ft.) were distributed thereby housing 125 families albeit in a temporary fashion.

On 1st January the 'Talent Hunter' team of our college distributed 125 bags of wheat flour of 4kg each to the affected people. The money was generated by our students by putting up a stall at the Damia Lions Utsav that raised Rs. 12,000. This was an initiative taken up by Nikhil Jain and group.

The Disaster Management Cell is proactive under the guidance of our Principal Dr. N. N. Pandey, the convener- Prof. Rajesh Ruke and members – Dr. Kiran Mane, Dr. Shiva Patil, Prof. Sachin Bansode and Prof. Shital Shah.

Lending a hand to heal the wounds of sorrow

The Department of Life Long Learning & Extension (DLLE) has been recognized as a Statutory Department of the University of Mumbai since 1994. It aims to promote a sustained rapport between the University & the Community. The Extension dimension of the Department facilitates the sensitization of the students to the socio-cultural realities. The department offers extension work projects encompassing social issues to the students.

The Department of Life Long Learning & Extension (DLLE) of our college started the enrollment of students from the month of June and it enrolled a total of 204 students for the academic year 2015-16.

The Department is spearheaded by Prof. (Ms) ShamiNimgulkar-Kamble (Economics Department) & three most enthusiastic teachers Prof. Mahendra Pachadkar (Commerce Department), Prof. (Mr) Sandeep Gupta (Mathematics & Statistics Department) & Ms. Rupali Kulkarni- Mishra (Co-ordinator- IT) . To ensure efficiency in the execution of the extension work & to assist the teachers in the work involved, the extension activity of the Student Managers was felt pivotal. The pillars of the department (Student Managers) were: Kothari Devang, Chauhan Vishal, Chaurasia Khushboo, Jain Dimple, Jain Chirag, Biyani Manisha, Chavan Yash, Agrawal Jyoti and Kamliya Stuti. The Department was inaugurated at the hands of Principal Dr. N. N. Pandey and Vice-Principal Dr. Shekhar Chandratre.

The Department this year enrolled students under extension work project titled "Survey of Women's Status". The purpose of this project is to get the students sensitized about the problems faced by women & to generate a sense of realization among students to be a contributory factor towards their empowerment. Our students conducted a survey of women in the age group of 15 -35 years. They interviewed 25 to 50 women each in the areas chosen under the project. These projects thus provide a forum for exchange of ideas, innovations, amassing knowledge & provides a chance to increase the representative voice of those traditionally under served & ignored in society.

The Extension work teachers attended the First Term Training Programme at Malini Kishore Sanghvi College, Vile-Parle on 20th August and the Second Term Training Programme at Vidyarthi Vidyapeeth Bhavan, Churchgate on 8th December. Our Field Coordinator Mr. Arvind Luhar addressed & guided our extension students in both the terms. His valuable guidance helped the students in completing their project work. As a part of the project work, students have also written essays of about 1500 words each on an array of social issues.

Our extension students participated in the **One Day Mega Medical Check-Up & Distribution Campaign organized by our college at Osarvira- A tribal village in Palghar District**. This campaign had twin objectives – i) To enable students understand the socio-economic realities of the under-privileged ii) To train students to grow up as responsible citizens without a self-centered worldview.

The Department of BMS had organized a Business Fair to Enhance the Entrepreneurship skills of the Students. 9 extension students- Chauhan Vishal, Jain Dimple, Agrawal Jyoti, Chaurasia Khushboo, Pawar Vaibhav, Shaikh Zafisha, Shah Shreya, Lohia Navratna and Shah Kajol participated in this Fair. They secured the

prize for "Best Decorated Stall" from the college. The entire profit amounting to Rs. 1100/- was donated by these students for the community project. As a part of this initiative, our extension students also donated clothes, school bags, notebooks, utensils, toys, etc. Two medical practitioners were assisted by our extension students in carrying out the Medical Check-Up Campaign. To instill the qualities of research among our students, we also undertook a research project to assess the Socio-Economic Status of the Tribals in the said village.

We are proud to state that our college won the Second prize at inter-collegiate skit competition-UDAAN - 'A Flight to Extension' organized by the The Department of Life Long Learning & Extension (DLLE), University of Mumbai on 15th January, at St. Francis Institute of Management and Research, Borivali. Our Drama Director- Mr. Rajendra Lokhandewas the driving force in polishing the acting skills of our budding extension actors. 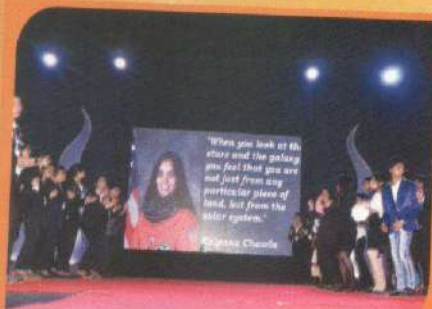

A girl is often killed inside the womb of the mother or after her birth knowingly and willingly at some places. The story however doesn't end here; instead of being supported by the society, she is criticized. At some places, girls are being forcefully pushed into prostitution.

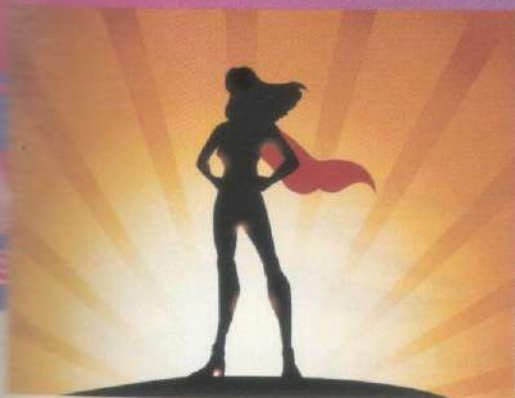

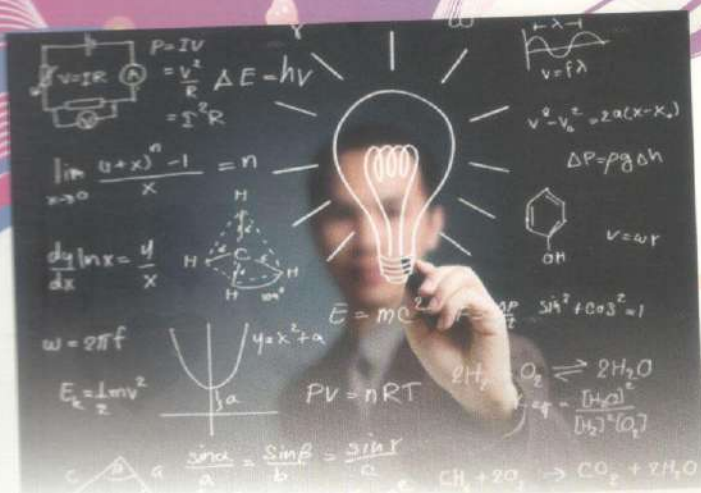

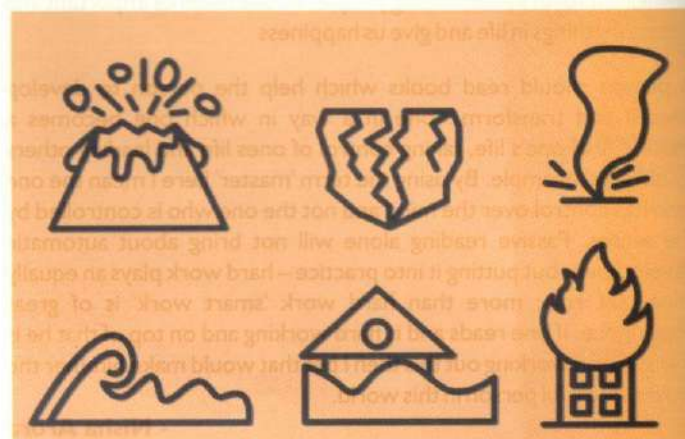

Half an hour turned into 1 hour, then 2 hours, later 3 hrs and so on. In the mean time all the other members of the society reached home one by one. The Rao family was extremely tensed especially because Mr. Rao had informed them that he would be home in ½ hrs. They tried his mobile number but there was no response. All the other society member tried frantically to locate Mr. Rao. Some people went to the police station, other dialled various help lines and some others got in touch with volunteers who were out on the road trying to rescue people. Mr. Rao unfortunately did not turn up and next day around 10.am, the family got a call stating that a body was seen floating in a nearby nullah. The Rao's worst fear got confirmed when they identified the body as that of Mr. Rao. A

शिक्षा या विद्या प्राप्त करने की भूख यदि विद्या प्राप्त करने के प्रारंभिक दिनों में ही जगाई जाए तो यह विद्यार्थियों के भविष्य निर्माण में अधिक सहायक होगी। और उनका सर्जनात्मक चरम विकास संभव है। क्योंकि वस्तुतः किशोरावस्था में ही चरित्र और मस्तिष्क गठन की प्रक्रिया अत्याधिक प्रभावपूर्ण होती है। अतः ऐसी अवस्था में यदि पढ़ाई के प्रति सही रुचि पैदा होगी तो यह विद्यार्थियों के भविष्य के लिए अच्छा होगा। क्योंकि प्रत्येक माता - पिता के मन में अपने बच्चों के लिए बड़ी-बड़ी आशाएँ होती हैं। उन्हें लगता है कि उनके बच्चे खूब पढ़ें, खूब प्रसिद्ध हों सभी उनकी जय-जयकार करें और उनका उत्कर्ष हो। उनके जीवन में कोई कठिनाई और दुःख न आएँ। यदि उनके जीवन में कठिनाई, दुःख आएँ तो उनका सामना करने का सामर्थ्य उनमें हो। लेकिन यह सब तभी संभव है जब हम शिक्षित हों।

आरंभिक दिनों में जो लोग पढ़ने से परहेज रखते हैं या कतराते हैं उनका भविष्य अंधकारमय हो जाता है तथा उनके व्यक्तित्व विकास में भी इसका प्रभाव पड़ता है तथा शेष जीवन गरीबी और दुःख झेलना पड़ता है। किन्तु जीवन में शिक्षा के इस पक्ष में जो सचेत हो जाते हैं उनमें आगे चलकर शिक्षा के साथ-साथ अच्छे संस्कार का भी निर्माण होता है। और वे अच्छे नागरिक बनकर सफलता तो अर्जित करते ही हैं साथ-साथ समाज को भी सही शिक्षा देने में समर्थ होते हैं।

मैं समझती हूँ कि पढ़ना और ज्ञान की पुस्तकें पढ़ना मन को परिशुद्ध करने के लिए आवश्यक है। अच्छी पुस्तको को पढ़ने से मानवीय चेतना और मानवीय विकास तथा विवेक का सही निर्माण होगा। आज की पूँजीवादी संस्कृति में मानव की आत्मीय गुणवत्ता का लोप होता जा रहा है। ऐसे समय में अच्छी पुस्तको को पढ़ना एक प्रकार की कठिन साधना है।

क्या भारत में मौत की सजा समाप्त होनी चाहिए?

भारत में मौत की सजा उचित है या नहीं यह प्रश्न अब भी विवादों में है। भारत एक लोकतांत्रिक देश है। भारतीय संविधान के अनुसार कुछ संगीन अपराध करने पर व्यक्ति को फाँसी की सजा का प्रावधान है। यह किसी भी दृष्टिकोण से न्यायसंगत नहीं है। मौत की सजा मानवाधिकार का हनन है, समाज में व्याप्त अपराध को मौत की सजा से पूर्ण रूप से समाप्त नहीं किया जा सकता है। व्यक्ति द्वारा अपराध करने पर कम से कम एक अवसर उसे सुधरने के लिए किसी तरह का प्रावधान या समय सीमा तय करनी चाहिए।

कुछ लोगों की व्यक्तिगत मजबूरियाँ बन जाती हैं कि वह किसी को जान से मारने की जिद पकड़ लेता है। कुछ लोग अपने आप पर नियंत्रण खो देते हैं और मौत को अंजाम देने पर पश्चाताप करते हैं। ऐसे लोगों की सजा - ए - मौत देने उस परिवार की भी स्थिति बिगड़ जाती है।

हमारे मतानुसार यदि व्यक्ति एक ही गलती बार-बार करता है तो उसे चेतावनी देकर वारदात न करने की सलाह देनी चाहिए यदि इस पर भी नहीं समझता है तो अपराध किस श्रेणी का है उसका भी वर्गीकरण होना चाहिए। कुछ देशों में चोरी करने के अपराध में हाथ जैसे अंगों के काटने की सजा सुनाई जाती है जिसे देखकर दूसरे व्यक्ति को एक प्रकार की सिख मिलती है कि चोरी की सजा इसे मिली है, इसलिए चोरी नहीं करनी है। बलात्कार करने की सजा कुछ हद तक ठीक है इससे बलात्कार की घटना कुछ हद तक रुक जायेगी। मौत की सजा एक गोपनीय जगह पर दी जाती है जिससे उसकी अंतिम इच्छा पूछी जाती है, क्यों? इसके पीछे क्या रहस्य है? वह अपने परिवार के किसी सदस्य से मिलने की इच्छा जाहिर करता

है। उसके परिवार पर क्या गुजरती है आप कल्पना भी नहीं कर सकते हैं। मौत सामने खड़ी है यह निश्चित है। मौत की सजा मानवीय रूप से एकदम गलत है। मौत की सजा को आजीवन कारावास बदल दिया जाय तो भी कुछ हद तक अति उत्तम है। अभी जल्द ही आतंकवादी अजमल कसाब को फाँसी दी गई, क्या आतंकवाद समाप्त हो गया है नहीं? विचारणिय प्रश्न यह है कि अजमल कसाब का उदाहरण देकर फाँसी की सजा धर्मग्रंथ के अनुसार सजा देने वाला भगवान ही मानव को मृत्यु देने का अधिकारी है। मानव को मानव की मौत देना किसी भी दृष्टिकोण से उचित नहीं है।

दोनों ही संसद हमले के दोषी अफजल गुरु को फाँसी दिए जाने को लेकर न्यूयॉर्क आधारित ह्यूमन राइट्स ब्रांच (एचआरडब्ल्यू) ने भारत सरकार की सरकार से सवाल उठाए हैं। एचआर डब्ल्यू ने कहा है कि केवल लोगों की भावनाओं को शांत करने के लिए फाँसी देना गलत है। भारत दोषियों को फाँसी देकर सही काम नहीं कर रहा है और भारत को फाँसी की सजा को खत्म कर देना चाहिए। ऐसा करके ही लोगों की भड़की भावनाओं को शांत किया जा सकता है।

एचआर डब्ल्यू की दक्षिण एशिया की डायरेक्टर मीनाक्षी गांगुली जी ने सवाल किया है कि भारत सरकार को अफजल गुरु को सजा देने की इस वकत रुक कर सोचनी चाहिए। उनका कहना है कि किसी भी अपराध के दोषी को यह सवाल उठाकर उसको बचाने की कोशीश नहीं की जा रही है। लेकिन फाँसी के जरिये दोषी को दर्दनाक मौत देना गलत है। उन्होंने कहा कि महज तीन माह के दौरान भारत में यह दूसरी फाँसी की सजा दी गई है। इससे पहले मुंबई हमले के दोषी अजमल कसाब को पुणे की जेल में फाँसी दी गई थी और वहीं पर उसको दफनाया भी दिया गया था।

गांगुली का कहना है कि भारत को इस तरह की कार्यवाही बंद कर देनी चाहिए। उन्होंने लोगों से भी यह अपील की है कि अफजल गुरु की फाँसी के बाद जब उन्हें इस सजा को पुरी तरह से खत्म करने के लिए पुरजोर मुहिम चलानी चाहिए। इससे न सिर्फ अफजल की मौत से गुस्साई जनता को शांत किया जा सकेगा बल्कि आनेवाले समय में माहौल को भी शांत बनाया जा सकेगा।

एक युवा वकील के मतानुसार मौत की सजा का कितना डर यह रोज आनेवाले लूट, रेप जैसे केस ही बता रहे हैं। जरूरत है की अमेरिका जैसे देश की ही तरह मौत से भी खतरनाक सजा जिसका लोगों में डर ही को लागू करके देस में सुधार किया जा सके। फाँसी खत्म हो गया तो समझो कानून खत्म इसलिए किसी को कुछ भी डर नहीं। छोटे से छोटे गुनाह के लिए भी सजा - ए - मौत मिलनी चाहिए।

हमारे देश की न्याय प्रणाली पहले ही काफी कमजोर है और अगर ऊपर से फांसी बंद कर दी गई तो अपराधियों को किसी बात का डर नहीं रहेगा। अपराधी खुलेआम अपराध को अंजाम देंगे क्योंकि इन्हें पता होगा की जितना भी गंभीर अपराध करो फांसी तो होगी ही नहीं इसलिए फांसी को किसी हालत में बंद नहीं करना चाहिए।

महात्मा गांधी जैसे महापुरुष के देश में “गोली के बदले गोली” थोड़ा अजीब सा लगता है खासकर तब जब कोई राजनेता ऐसी बातें करे हमारा देश उतना मजबूत नहीं है जितना होना चाहिए। तभी तो पाकिस्तान जैसे देश के आतंकवादियों ने २६ नवंबर २०११ को ताज होटल पर हमला किया था। हमारे देश के कितने पुलिसवाले, मासूम जनता शहीद हो गए। फिर भी तुरंत फांसी की सजा सुनाने के बजाय कई वर्षों के बाद सजा सुनाई। इसी से पता चलता है की हमारा कानून किसी भी काम का नहीं है। इसके लिए हमें एक नए कानून की जरूरत है ताकी देश के अपराधियों के मन में मौत की सजा का खिलाफ डर पैदा हो सके।

जुर्म करने वालों को, जुर्म सिद्ध होने पर पब्लिक प्लेस में लेकर दर्दनाक मौत देने का प्रावधान होना चाहिए। किसी लड़की की इज्जत से खिलवाव करनेवालों को कम से कम फांसी की सजा तो होनी चाहिए। १९ दिसंबर २०१२ की वो रात जो की एक लड़की की कालीरात बनकर रह गई। उस लड़की का बेरहमी से बलात्कार कर उसे मार दिया गया। ऐसा करनेवालों को मेरे मुताबिक जुर्म सिद्ध होने पर तुरंत फांसी देनी चाहिए थी। परंतु हमारे भारत में बलात्कार का कानून बहुत नरम है। ६ से ७ साल की सजा इससे क्या होगा। इसमें बदलाव अगर सरकार अपराधियों को मौत से भी बदतर सजा नहीं पाती है तो सरकार भी उन अपराधियों के अपराध में बराबर होती है।

चीन में अन्य देशों से अधिक मृत्युदंड की सजा सुनाई जाती है। चीन में मृत्युदंड की सजा २०१० में १७७० है जो अन्य देशों से चार गुना अधिक है।

याकूब की सजा का विरोध संयुक्त राष्ट्र महासचिव बान की मून ने १९९३ में मुंबई बम धमाके के दोषी याकूब मेमन को फांसी दिए जाने पर अपना विरोध जताया है। उनका कहना है कि मौत की सजा का २१ वीं शताब्दी में कोई स्थान नहीं है। उन्होंने यह अपनी बात दोहराते हुए कहा कि वह दुनिया भर के अन्य देशों से अपिल करते हैं कि वे मौत की सजा को खत्म करने पर विचार करें। उन्होंने मौत की सजा को निर्मम और अमानवीय मृत्यु करार दिया। ऐसा नहीं की गोली के बदले गोली होनी चाहिए। अगर ऐसा था, तो गांधीजी ने अहिंसा का रास्ता क्यों अपनाया। महाराष्ट्र के लोग भी देश के अन्य राज्यों में रहने हैं। अगर मुंबई पुलिस इतनी क्रियाशील है तो आतंकवादियों के खिलाफ कार्यवाही में जल्दबाजी क्यों नहीं दिखते। बम का जवाब बम से क्यों नहीं देते।

यह तो सभी जानते हैं कि भारत में किसी की हत्या करने पर दौषसिद्धि के उपरान्त आजीवन कारावास की सजा का प्रावधान है। जहाँ तक फांसी की सजा है तो केवल हत्या के लिए मौत की सजा नहीं दी जाती। भारत में रेअर ऑफ रेंयरेस्ट अर्थात् जघन्यतम अपराध के लिए फांसी की सजा का प्रावधान है। जो लोग मौत की सजा को उचित नहीं मानते उन्हें मैं प्रियदर्शिनी मट्टू हत्याकांड का उदाहरण देना चाहूंगी। दिल्ली में पढ़नेवाली छात्रा प्रियदर्शिनी मट्टू का एक सरफिरे युवक ने बलात्कार किया और सिर पर लगानेवाले हेलमेट से उसके चेहरे पर उन्नीस बार मारा और उसकी हत्या कर दी।

कोर्ट ने दोषी की सजा का ऐलान करते हुए कहा कि यह जघन्यतम हत्या है और इसके लिए मौत की सजा से कम सजा देना पीड़िता के साथ अन्याय होगा। मित्रों कम से कम भारत जैसे लोकतांत्रिक देश में तो ऐसे अपराधियों के साथ कोई सहानुभूति नहीं होनी चाहिए। लेकिन तथाकथित मानवाधिकारों के दुकान चलानेवाले लोग चर्चा में बने रहने के लिए और मीडिया कवरेज के लिए ऐसी बातों को अनावश्यक तूल देते हैं।

१९९३ के मुंबई ब्लास्ट के आरोपी याकूब मेमन की फांसी पर जो राजनीति हुई उसने पूरे देश को शर्मसार कर दिया। सैकड़ों निर्दोष लोगों का खून बहानेवाले और सरकारी संपत्ति को नुकसान पहुँचाने वाले एक देशद्रोही के लिए जितनी संवेदना और सहानुभूति देखी गई उससे अन्य लोगों का सिर शर्म से झुक गया। देशद्रोही केवल वे नहीं हैं जो देश विरोधी गतिविधियों में लिप्त हैं। बल्कि देशद्रोही वे भी हैं जो याकूब जैसे लोगों की फांसी का विरोध करते हैं।

दोस्तों, मानवाधिकारों की दुहाई देनेवाले तब कहाँ थे, जब दिल्ली युवक कांग्रेस के अध्यक्ष सुशील शर्मा ने अपनी पत्नी के टुकड़े कर के उसे तंदूर में जलाया था। और देश में तब भी बहुत ही - हल्ला मचा था। जब एक लड़की का बलात्कार और उसकी हत्या के जुर्म में धनंजय चटर्जी को फांसी दी गई थी। वास्तव में मौत की सजा को आजीवन कारावास में बदलना या इसे समाप्त करना, अपराधियों के मनोबल बढ़ाना है। मौत की सजा देने से अपराधियों में डर होगा। और वे इस तरह का अपराध करने से पहले कम से कम एक बार जरूर सोचेंगे।
