
To promote research climate in the college, IQAC was instrumental in

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell undertook the following Initiatives:

All quality related issues are routed through the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) so as to improve the teaching-learning processes and encourage a culture of excellence.

Curricular Activities initiated and encouraged by the IQAC:

Orientation: All the First year Students were given an Orientation to the culture of the college. The rules and regulations, the examination system and the curricular and extra –curricular activities wherein they could engage themselves were explained to them through PowerPoint presentations by the Convener/ Chairperson of the committee/ association.

Remedial Classes: Special Remedial Classes in the subject of Business Communication and Environmental Studies were conducted.

Planning and implementation: Departmental and committee plans were encouraged and its implementation was facilitated.

Best practices of this year:

Research Cell and Department of Accountancy organized GUIDANCE workshops for NET/SLET Aspirants.

Department of Economics - Foundation Course encouraged **student visits to NGOs** in order to sensitize them to the problems and issues that plague our society so as to give them opportunities to contribute to the society. A total of 55 NGO run ashrams/orphanages/old age homes / anti-human trafficking centres / special schools / were visited by 55 groups of students of FYBCom and SYBCom.

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Student involvement:

Student Managers Committee: A Student Manager committee is formed to inculcate the event management skill for various events conducted at college level. SM Committee Comprises of three heads along with 6 Departments - Accounting & Documentation, Logistics & Decoration, Photography, Hosting, Public Relations and Information Technology. The SMC consisted of total 81 student members and a teacher in-charge. They were given the charge of organizing several events for the students and administrative staff of the college.

Quality Circle: A students 'group was formed as the Quality Circle that functioned as the logistic support group of the IQAC. Data collection related to Feedback, raw data analysis, file compilation, typing of formats, etc. was handled by the Quality Circle throughout the year.

Academic Audit: The academic audit of the departments was conducted on 3rd October 2016; the Revised Academic Audit was held on 30th March 2017.

'Reading Room' facility: 'Reading Room' facility for students who would want to use the college premises for studying purpose was started from 1st February 2017.

Workshop: A One Day Awareness Programme on 'ISO 9001:2015' was conducted on 5th October 2016 for the teaching and administrative staff of the college.

Parent-Teacher Meetings – Throughout the year regular Parent-Teacher meetings were organized so as to give and get feedback on the progress and growth of students.

The Theme of the year unanimously decided was: **Keeping Nature in our Future**. Accordingly a variety of initiatives were planned and executed –

- The IQAC along with the Commerce Department organized an **Exhibition** on the Theme.
- The Department of Business Communication organized an **Inter-collegiate conference** on 'Environmental Sustainability: Issues at the nexus of a better tomorrow'.
- The students undertook a Swacchta Abhiyaan cleaning up the college premises.

- A visit to Ruia Agro Farm at Manor an organic farm at Manor was organized on 26th January 2017. The 30 acres of lush green land with the back drop of the gurgling river and the rich fertile soil offered a unique organic farming experience to the teaching faculty





Immersive Learning

In our crusade of building learning environments that create a lasting learning experience we introduced newer ways of engaging our students in Immersive learning experiences.

- A photo coverage was encouraged on the basis of the students; visit to Wada Ecoforest.
- Students were asked to compile a bulletin after their visit to the Prince of Wales Museum.

Success stories of immersive learning methodology:

Abhishek Kambli,T.Y.BSc.IT student, who worked on a news app for IOS live project that compiles news from 75 e-papers and category wise displays current news is now working as a designer for TLKN - mobile app with aim to reconnect people and make them talk again. (TLKN has featured in top sites like product hunt, and news channel NDTV. TLKN just crossed 10k users on play store.) He has also designed and been part of coding team for a call centre application called "samespace", which is now used by more than 15 call centre companies in world. Abhishek is now working on mobile app called MUSE and also created website and blog for DLITA association.

Vijay Mishra our SYBSc(IT) student, has designed website and APP for DLU2K16, our college fest.

Intercollegiate Conference

Continuing last year's experiment in immersive teaching methodology – also a Best Practice by the department of Business Communication and IQAC – two student Conferences were organised. The common misconception about the institution is that it is a Juvenile prison meant for detention of hardcore delinquents. Nothing is far from truth.

The visit to the institution clarified this misconception. our students and teachers realised that it is, in fact a formal education and vocational training center with emphasis on character building. The issue being a psychological one, the services of paramedical staff is enlisted besides those of teachers and instructors. Reformation of Juvenile delinquents on one hand and total physical, mental and emotional development on the other are the most important functions of the school. Thus our students were sensitised to the various social problems that bring these children here and were encouraged to appreciate the efforts taken by the institution to provide for the 'children in need of care and protection and nurture them.





99 % of students answered this question. 63% found the syllabus 'Adequate' and 3 % students found it 'Inadequate'.






3. Difficulty level of the course






5. Library facility for the course.


















14. Effect of the internal assessment on course grade.








18. Implementation of the lecture schedule



























The Dalmian Community Project: Reaching out to Tribal village – Osarvira, Palghar District

Love in action is service. - Padma Vibhushan Sri Sri RaviShankar

The word Social Responsibility is very significant in today's time when deprivation, inequality and suffering are staring us in the eye even as the per capita incomes increase and the middle class inches upward.

We can serve others in endless ways by using our own creativity and imagination. When one looks for opportunities, it is easy to locate small ways to help even amidst busy daily routines. In line with the theme of the extension unit of "Reaching the Unreached", it was decided to carry on the assistance programme more intensively and extensively with the necessary aid from Lions Club of Malad-Borivli in the adopted village **Osarvira,Taluka: Dahanu in Palghar District**. The village is situated 120 kms from Mumbai.

A need assessment survey was conducted for determining and addressing needs and identifying "gaps" between current conditions and desired conditions. Lion Vivek R. Narsaria, President, Lions Club of Malad-Borivli along with the extension teachers – Dr. Swati Desai, Dr. Kiran Mane, Mr. Rajesh Ruke and Ms. Shami Nimgulkar- Kamble conducted this survey on 2nd January, 2017. Data was elicited from the former Sarpanch –Mr. Naresh Korda, Rozgar Sevak Mr. Dilip Korda and teachers of Zilla Parishad Schools – Mr. Rajeshwar Biradar and Mr.Deepak Sonawane. This survey helped in clearly identifying the problem and for directing the resources towards developing and implementing a feasible and applicable solution.

As a small medium of contributing towards society, we conducted **a One Day Mega Medical Check – Up and Distribution Campaign in the adopted village - Osarvira** on Friday, 13th January, 2017 along with 40 committed student volunteers and 8 degree college teachers. Committed students of extension unit (DLLE, NSS, NCC) and Students' Council helped in undertaking this projects for the third time in a row.

A day prior to the campaign, a group of 6 volunteers along with 2 teachers visited the village for pre-camp arrangements order to facilitate smooth execution of the campaign on the said day.

A glimpse of activities conducted:

Distribution of Blankets, Sports items, Soaps:

Around 300 Zilla Parishad school children from standard I to VII were donated blankets and Soaps. Sports items like Footballs, Skipping ropes, Carrom boards, Badminton Kits and Cricket Kits were donated to the school.

Medical Camp:

The adopted village lacked basic health infrastructure and the immediate health relief is available only 10 kms away from the village. This situation called for timely care and diagnosis. The

Health Care Camp was one such special initiative by the Lions Club of Malad-Borivli to meet the immediate health care needs of the marginalized community in remote rural areas. Lion Dr. Ajeet Jain and his team of dedicated doctors were instrumental in providing basic health care facilities to the patients.

Around 300 patients took benefit of this camp.

Women primarily suffered from backache as they had to fetch water from long distance. Vitamin tablets were administered to them. The men were found to be suffering with health issues related to heavy drinking. Many cataract patients were also diagnosed. Most of the children suffered from severe problem of scabies. Students were given ointments, soaps and medicines free of cost. All the patients were given general medicines and those who were found to be having larger health issues were advised to visit the general hospital at the earliest.

Donation of Footwear to School Children: Foot ware were donated to 100 girl school children of three Zilla Parishad Schools.

Donation of Green Cloth: To provide respite to the school children and the villagers from the scorching heat and to provide them shade, green cloth was donated to the Zilla Parishad schools and the Gram Panchayat office.

Donation of Sarees and Towels: 200 women were donated sarees and 150 men were donated towels.

Inauguration of Toilet Blocks:

Poor sanitation exposes females to the risk of assault, and when schools cannot provide clean, safe toilets girls' attendance drops.

Poor sanitation has significant impacts on the safety, well-being and educational prospects of women. Girls' lack of access to a clean, safe toilet, especially during menstruation, perpetuates risk, shame and fear. This has long-term impacts on women's health, education, livelihoods and safety but it also impacts the economy, as failing to provide for the sanitation needs of women ultimately risks excluding half of the potential workforce.

The village faces the problem of open defecation. The Zilla Parishad school for students of Standard VI and VII lack toilets leading to a crisis that contributes to disease and childhood malnutrition.

On realizing the gravity of this critical issue, the Lions Club of Malad-Borivli promised construction of two toilet blocks for the Zilla Parishad school (one for Boys and one for girls).

Donation of Wheel Chair:

Two Wheel Chairs were donated to physically disabled students to bring about a ray of hope in their bleak lives and to foster the attitude of - "Yes... Even I can" in them.

All the above mentioned donations and contributions were possible due to the special and concerted efforts of the President of Lions Club of Malad-Borivli, Lion Vivek R. Narsaria and other Lion members.

The students and teachers of our college in their own small way also made valuable donations. Details of donation are mentioned below:

Best Practice No.2

1. Title of the Practice:

Learning by doing: Reaching out to NGOs – Old Age Home, Orphanage, Special Homes, etc

2. Goal:

- To develop & understand the problems faced by different sections of our society.
- To inculcate a sense of responsibility & sensitivity towards the less privileged members of the society.

3. The Context:

The subject of Foundation Course is a Skill Enhancement Course with Two Credits for the BCom Course of University of Mumbai. one of the objectives of the subject is to develop a basic understanding about issues related to human rights violations, ecology and urban-rural disparities in access to health and education.

The major topics covered under this subject are: Overview of the Indian Society, Concept of Disparity and the Indian Constitution., Human Rights, Rights to Health & Education.

The project/assignment in the subject as per the university norms can take the form of street-plays/power-point presentations/poster exhibitions and similar other modes of presentation appropriate to the topic. But theoretical understanding of such crucial issues is not enough. In order to sensitise our students towards such crucial issues in ways that will create a long lasting impact the teachers of Foundation Course encouraged students to visit NGOs, specifically those working with orphanages, old age homes and special homes.

4. The Practice:

Students divided themselves in groups and visited these NGOs. They interacted with the inmates of these homes in a variety of ways : playing games, by donating gifts & foodstuffs, celebrated birthday, danced & sang, helped them in cooking, etc. By closely observing them, they carefully studied the situation in depth and these experiences were then noted down and presented in groups in the form of PPT presentation and photographs were compiled.

The entire FYBCOM & SYBCOM classes were involved in this project.

- 5. Evidence of Success: The students were extremely happy to share their experiences as they understood the hard facts of life and problems of a variety of sections of people at close quarters. The first hand experience they gained at Old Age Homes made them reach out to the youngsters and urged them to take care of their elders so as to never sending them in such Homes.
- 6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required: The motivation of the students and their enthusiasm was the only investment required in this venture. The students spent their time with the inmates of the homes run by the NGOs, they even shared few items such as chocolates and biscuits with them.

The challenges faced by the students in the process were : The students were not sponsored. They themselves contributed for the entire activity. The students had to convince some of the NGOs since they were not permitted easily.
