



Disaster Management Cell

While India always welcomes the monsoon season for bringing respite from the summer heat and replenishing parched reservoirs, in 2019, it had wreaked havoc in parts of western Maharashtra, where over 80 people lost their lives and almost lakhs got displaced after unprecedented rains. Heavy showers pounded several districts in western Maharashtra, including Sangli, Kolhapur, Pune, Satara and some parts of Konkan, causing flooding and damaging crops in the months of August and September 2019.

As several villages got marooned, the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) and army had to be pressed into action to rescue people stranded there. In response to the need of the hour, our college decided to undertake flood relief material distribution operation on a mega scale. A primary survey was conducted by Prof. Sachin Bansode, who went personally to the flood affected areas of Satara and Konkan. As per his findings, it was realised that, lot of relief materials provided by government and NGOs had already reached the villages at the base but no government agencies or NGOs were able to reach the villages situated at the top of the hills.

Primary research conducted by Prof. Bansode made him realised that the villages on the top have lost all their cultivation and agricultural produce owing to heavy rains and are in dire need of some immediate help. Accordingly, it was decided that our prime motto for flood relief operation will be Reaching the Unreached. We wanted to be the first to help these villagers. Six villages namely Male, Koine, Kasheli, Vajegaon and Patharpunj, Taluka: Patan, District: Satara and Tiware, Tal: Chiplun, Dist: Ratnagiri were identified and finalized for undertaking distribution of relief materials. Patharpunj village received a total rainfall approx. 9,000 mm in the year 2019, highest rainfall not only in India but in the entire world. A call was made to all teachers, Ex Students, students and neighbouring community for generous donations in cash as well as kind. Favourable response from Management Members, all the teachers of Degree college, Self-Financed Courses, Junior College as well as students, ex-students and neighbouring community meant that we were able to collect sizeable amount of relief material within a short period of time. On 20th September, afternoon Prof. Sachin Bansode and Sattappa Kambale along with the truck full of collected relief material left for Chiplun.



On 21st September, 2019 morning they were joined by Prof. Rajesh Ruke and ten students representing DLLE, NSS, Students' Council, NCC, Equal Opportunity Cell, Sustainable lifestyle @ agriculture project at Chiplun. On 21st September, 2019 the relief operation was undertaken from morning starting from Tiware in Chiplun, and then Kolne, Male, Patharpunj, Vajegaon and finally kasheli at Satara.

The entire operation was planned and executed with perfection in one single day. Some of the places were located at the top of the Sahayadri ranges deep into dense forest where due to landslides and heavy rainfall proper approach roads were missing. It took our team around three hours to cross a distance of merely 15 kilometres from our base camp to reach villages like Kolne and Patharpunj. It was once in the lifetime experience for the entire team. We are glad that the entire operation was successful with only minor hitches and we as a team are very proud that we could travel all together 800 kilometres [from Mumbai to Tiware (Chipun) to Kolne, Patharpunj, Male, Kasheli, Karad (Satara) and back] to make it happen and did it to the best of our ability. The smile on the faces of the affected villagers made our entire efforts worthwhile. The satisfactions which we all earned will be difficult to put it across in words appropriately. It could be only experienced and felt and we are glad that our students could take this surreal, pious first-hand experience of helping those in need.

Total Material Collected:

Total relief material collected was worth Rs. 4,08,000 including cash Rs.74,000 donated by all teachers and Administrative staff of Degree College, Junior College and Self-Financed Courses as well as donors from community. Material Collected included the following: Rice, wheat, Sugar, Refined Oil, pulses, Pressure Cookers, Blankets, Mosquito nets, Towels, bed Sheets, Sanitary Pads, Soaps, Biscuits, Medicines etc.

DEPARTMENT OF LIFELONG LEARNING AND EXTENSION (DLLE)

“A Learning Curve is essential to growth.” – Tammy Bjelland

The Department of Lifelong Learning & Extension (DLLE) has been recognized as a Statutory Department of the University of Mumbai since 1994. It aims to promote a sustained rapport between the University & the Community. The Extension dimension of the Department facilitates the sensitization of the students to the socio-cultural realities. The department offers extension work projects encompassing social issues to the students.

The Department of Life Long Learning & Extension (DLLE) of our college started the enrollment of students from the month of June and it enrolled a total of 201 students for the academic year 2019-2020. The Department is spearheaded by Dr. Shami Nimgulkar- Kamble (Economics Department) & three most enthusiastic teachers Dr. Mahendra Pachadkar (Law Department), Mr. Sandeep Gupta (Mathematics & Statistics Department) and Ms. Priyanka Radhakrishnan (Self-Financing Courses). To ensure efficiency in the execution of the extension work & to assist the teachers in the work involved, the extension activity of the Student Managers was felt pivotal. The pillars of the department (Student Managers) were: Mr. Omkar Mahadik, Mr. Adwait Khatu, Ms. Mehek Panchal, Mr. Rhutik Kokate, Ms. Vaibhavi Patel, Mr. Devesh Pednekar, Mr. Ronak Jain and Mr. Subham Jadhav.

The Department this year enrolled students under 2 extension work projects:

1. “Survey of Women’s Status (SWS)” and
2. “Population Education Club (PEC)”.

The purpose of SWS project is to make the students sensitized about the problems faced by women & to generate a sense of realization among students to be a contributory factor towards their empowerment. Our students conducted a survey of women in the age group of 20-60 years. They interviewed 25 to 50 women each in the areas chosen under the project. These projects thus provide a forum for exchange of ideas, innovations, amassing knowledge & provides a chance to increase the representative voice of those traditionally underserved & ignored in society.

Rapid growth of population in India has become a matter of concern for one and all. Growing population is not an issue of numbers alone. But it is an issue which is intimately related and has implications for socioeconomic development, environment and quality of life of our citizens. In order to slow down population growth and accelerate the process of improving the quality of life of our citizens, multi-pronged initiatives are being taken. Integration of Population Education in all sectors of Education (i.e. formal and non-formal) is one such initiative. The purpose of this initiative is to educate the present generation about population, development and environment for a better quality of life of their own and at their future generations.

The Extension work teachers attended:

1. The First Term Training Programme at B.L. Amlani College of Commerce and Economics, Vile Parle on 2nd July 2019.
2. The Second Term Training Programme at Chandrabhan Sharma College of Arts, Science and Commerce, Powai on 14th December 2019.

Our Field Coordinator Dr. Sulbha Raorane addressed & guided our extension students in both the terms. Her valuable guidance helped the students in completing their project work.

As a part of the project work, students have also written essays of about 1500 words each on an array of social issues.

List of activities created in the A.Y.2019-2020 are:

- **Rally to create awareness about Blood donation:** On 17th September, 2019 a rally was organized to create awareness among masses about the importance of blood donation. The rally started from our college and covered the entire Sunder Nagar vicinity. It concluded at Chincholi Bunder Road.

- **Blood Donation:** It is one of the best things that one can do for others. Donating blood can help someone in getting a new life. The Department organized Blood Donation Camp on 19th September 2019.



- **Flood Relief Camp:** As a part of the Institutional Social Responsibility, we took up the project of providing relief to the people affected by flood this year. This endeavor of ours is also in line with the theme of our institution which is the “Art of Giving.” An intensive survey of the flood affected areas was conducted.

Here is a brief overview of the findings :

1. **Tiware:** Tiware Dam was built 14 years ago with a capacity of 20 lakh cubic meters. Heavy rainfall led to a breach in the Tiware Dam in Maharashtra's Ratnagiri district at around 9.30 pm on July 2, 2019 and seven down-stream villages were flooded. Search and rescue operations were launched by the NDRF and State police. Approximately 45 families lost their livelihood including the loss of livestock, the destruction of farmlands, houses, bridges, schools and health facilities, as well as damage to the water supply, irrigation systems. Thus they were severely affected because of the timing and scale of the floods.
2. **Patharpunj:** Patharpunj in Patan tehsil of Satara district emerged as the wettest place in India during this monsoon as of date, with higher rainfall than Cherrapunji in Meghalaya. Between June 1 and August 24, Patharpunj received 7,359mm of rainfall as against 5,938.4mm rainfall in Cherrapunji (Hindustan Times, Aug 25, 2019). There are 200 families who lost all their cultivation of rice and other food items because of the heavy rains. They live in the forest areas. Due to the absence of all-weather roads, they travel long distances by foot only once in a week to buy their grocery. There are Kutcharoads, but due to heavy rains, they are washed away.

On realizing the plight of these tormented souls, we decided to conduct distributional and relief activities in Tiware (Chiplun Taluka) and Patharpunj (Satara District) – Maley, Kolney, Kasheli, Vajegaon villages. We succeeded in collecting relief material to assist 250 affected families. Management Members, students, ex-students, neighboring communities extended their helping hand and we could collect essential commodities as well as durable commodities. Our team led by two teachers and our Student Manager Mr. Omkar Mahadik along with 9 other students personally visited these places on 20th and 21st September, 2019 for overseeing and participating in the relief operation. The terrain was difficult but sheer determination and perseverance of the entire team made this camp a big success.

- **MUSKAAN-**The Department initiated “MUSKAAN”- a drive to spread smiles. This drive was conducted throughout the year. As a part of this drive, 13 groups of DLLE students visited various orphanages in Goregaon, Malad, Borivali and Bhayander. The students interacted with the children. They organized several competitions for them. They played games like cricket and basket - ball with them. They also taught them poems and made them recite after them. Extension students served them home-made food. Students donated stationary, drawing books, colours to them. The extension students also discussed environmental issues with them and explained to them how they can be contributory factors in reducing the environmental hazards. Some students also spent time with families who were not blessed with an abode and also served them food.

Extension students also visited old age homes and entered into lively discussions with them to bring a smile on their worried faces.

- **Seminar on Physical Fitness:** Physical and mental fitness plays an important role in relieving stress, anxiety, depression and anger. The Department organized a Seminar on “Physical and Mental Fitness” on 22nd November, 2019. The resource person invited for this purpose was – Mr. Sunder Chand Thakur, a marathoner, motivational speaker and resident editor of NavBharat Times.
- **College Level Activities:** Two College level activities were conducted – Poster Making and Essay Writing on 4th December 2019 and 9th January 2020 respectively. Students were asked to prepare posters and write essays on various socio-economic issues. The Department awarded students with cash prizes and certificates for the Best Posters and Best Essays.
- **Talk on “Entrepreneurial Development through Innovative ideas”:** Considering the importance of self-employment in the current situation and to harness the entrepreneurial skills of the extension students, a talk on “Entrepreneurial Development through Innovative ideas” was organized. Mr. Willibrord George, Principal and CEO of St. Willibrords School, Education Entrepreneur and Leadership Trainer was invited. This talk was organized on 17th January, 2020.

We are proud to state that our college won the **Consolation prize at inter-collegiate skit competition–UDAAN – ‘A Flight to Extension’ organized by the Department of Life Long Learning & Extension (DLLE), University of Mumbai on 3rd February, 2019 at St. Francis Institute of Management and Research.** Our skit titled “BOL KI LAB AAZAD HE TERE”, performed at the UDAAN festival conveyed a strong social message of – Respect to the Constitution. Our extension work actors- Mr. Omkar Mahadik, Ms. Vaibhavi Patel, Ms. Mehek Panchal, Mr. Adwait Khatu, Mr. Rhutik Kokate, Mr. Devesh Pednekar, Mr. Shubham Jadhav, Ms. Divya Ravindran, Ms. Kamakshi Swami, Ms. Shraddha Shinde, Ms. Pallavi Nabar, Mr. Vedant Sathghare, Mr. Kalpesh Kongil, Ms. Sanjanben Soni, Ms. Hastina Shaha and Ms. Madhura Panchal received words of appreciation from both the audience as well as the judges. The college felicitated their efforts and dedicated perseverance by awarding them with appreciation certificates on the occasion of Annual Prize Distribution Ceremony.
