



AN ONLINE COMMUNICATION SKILLS COURSE FOR ALL STUDENTS AT MUMBAI UNIVERSITY

Mumbai University is happy to announce an online Communication Skills Course for all students at Mumbai University, by Professor Klaus Stierstorfer, University of Muenster, Germany with whom the university has a long standing academic partnership. He has decided to give the Communication Skills Course I for free this year in acknowledgement of the hardships caused by the Corona crisis and as a gesture towards the longstanding collaboration and friendship between Muenster and Mumbai Universities.

The Communication Skills Course is an international course which provides students with the necessary skills in communication in English in the most important communication situations they are currently exposed to as students and will expect to face as job applicants, in their working lives and socially.

The Course is provided by EduNet Solutions Private Limited, which has been founded by Dr. Klaus Stierstorfer, University Professor and Chair of British Studies at the University of Muenster, Germany, and Angelika Nied, M.Sc. Econ, a banker in Frankfurt, Germany, for the purpose of distributing online courses of highest academic and professional standards.

EduNet Solutions Private Limited will distribute the course for Mumbai University on the provision of email addresses of all students who wish to take the course. They will feed these into the system which will create an access code for each of the students and send it to them with access information. Students then can start right away on Course I on the EduNet site. Course I of 10 sessions will be provided free of cost to all students of Mumbai University. Those students who want to go on to **Communication Skills Course II** will need to pay a nominal fee. At the end of Course I they will find an internet link taking them on to Course II.
