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


METHODOLOGY	The entire event was conducted in the auditorium IN OFFLINE MODE.

The BBI Department of Prahladrai Dalmia Lions College of Commerce & Economics successfully organized an interactive student event titled "**Break the Ice 2K26**" on February 18, 2026. Held in the college auditorium under the guidance of Coordinator CA Durgesh Kenkre, the event was designed to foster a sense of community, improve interpersonal communication, and provide a platform for students to demonstrate teamwork and coordination in a high-energy environment. The program was structured into three distinct rounds, each meticulously planned to challenge the participants' mental and physical agility while ensuring an atmosphere of fun and healthy competition.



The event commenced with **Round 1: "The Floor is Ice,"** a coordination-based challenge where teams had to navigate a zig-zag path. One player was tasked with guiding their partner, who had to move with precision; any misstep or loss of direction resulted in penalties. This round served as an excellent icebreaker, highlighting the importance of clear communication and trust between teammates.

The second phase of the event, **Round 2: "Feel it to Reveal,"** focused on non-verbal communication. In this game, one participant had to "draw" a word on their partner's back, and the partner had to guess the word correctly based solely on the sensation. This round emphasized focus and the ability to interpret subtle cues.

The competition reached its peak with **Round 3: "Ice Breakers" (Scavenger Hunt).** Teams were given task cards requiring them to find specific, often rare, items within the auditorium—such as

antique watches, foreign currency, junior college IDs, or specific stationery—within a strict time limit. This final round tested the participants' resourcefulness and their ability to perform under pressure.

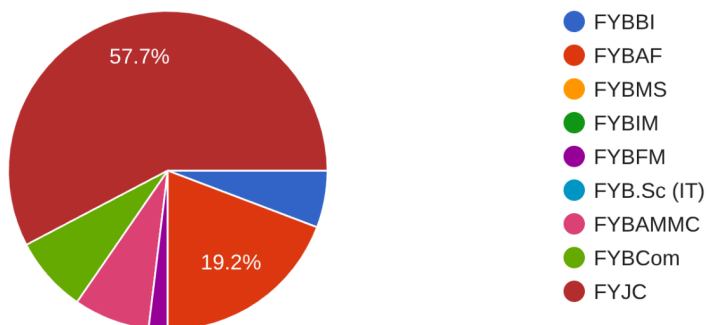
The event concluded with a formal acknowledgment of the winners who displayed exceptional speed and teamwork. The first prize of ₹2,250 was awarded to Mr. Jagmal Rajpurohit and Ms. Janvi Singh (FYJC), followed by Ms. Ravina Choudhary and Ms. Ruchita Rajput (FYJC) in second place with ₹1,750, and Ms. Naziya Shaikh and Ms. Nidhita Yadav (FYBAF) securing the third position with ₹1,250. Overall, "Break the Ice 2K26" was a resounding success, achieving its objective of enhancing student engagement and building a stronger, more connected campus culture.

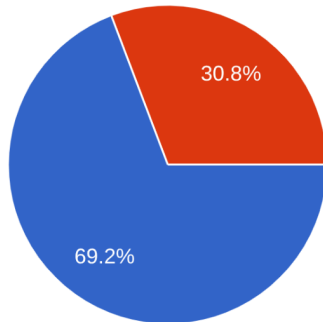

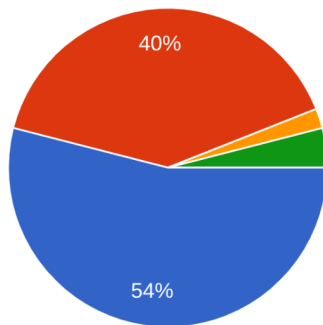

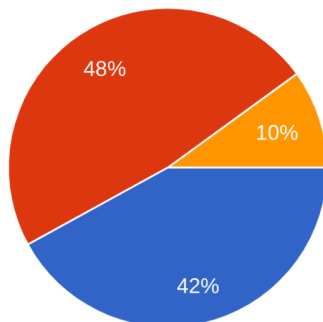

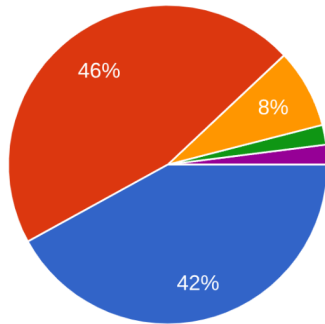

Arrangement done during the event

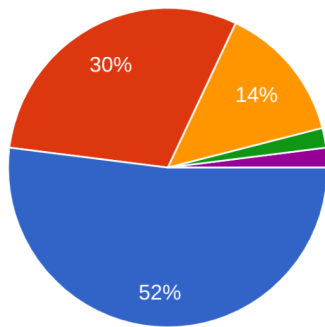

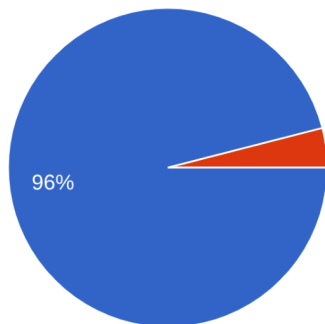
