## Brief Descriptive Report of NSS Special Residential Camp Activities

### Pre-Camp Activities (5 January 2026)

Prior to the commencement of the NSS Special Residential Camp, preparatory meetings and coordination activities were undertaken to ensure the smooth conduct of the camp. A meeting was held with the Medical Officers of the Primary Health Care Clinics at Gholvad and Ashagad to finalize the schedule and arrangements for the health camps to be conducted during the camp period. An official intimation letter regarding the NSS camp was submitted to Gholvad Police Station, and the police authorities were invited to conduct an awareness session on Cyber Security for the volunteers and the local community. In addition, a discussion was held with the authorities of NBSS to finalize arrangements for accommodation and food facilities for the NSS volunteers. A total of 6 NSS volunteers participated in these preparatory activities.

### **Day 1 – 6 January 2026**

The first day of the camp began with a Group Formation Session, followed by an engaging session on Group Bonding conducted by Mr. Sandesh Ladge from Nirmala Niketan College of Social Work. The session emphasized teamwork, mutual understanding, and unity among volunteers to ensure effective coordination throughout the camp. The rules and regulations of the camp were also explained to maintain discipline and safety. Later, the volunteers visited the Smriti Stall to pay tribute to women revolutionaries Padma Bhushan Tarabai Modak and Padma Shri Anutai Wagh, learning about their significant contributions to education and social development. 153 NSS volunteers participated and 153 beneficiaries were covered.

### **Day 2 – 7 January 2026**

A Sickle Cell Detection Camp was organized in collaboration with PHC Ashagad at Gokhale Ashram School, where children aged 6–8 years were screened for Sickle Cell Anaemia. Dr. Rajesh Bombe visited the camp along with ten students from the Medical and Counselling Cell and interacted with the participants. The NSS volunteers also visited Krishi Vigyan Kendra, where they attended practical sessions on beekeeping and explored the nursery of medicinal plants, gaining exposure to agricultural practices and rural livelihoods. A total of 153 volunteers participated, and 80 beneficiaries were served.

### **Day 3 – 8 January 2026**

On the third day, NSS volunteers conducted educational sessions for students from Std. I to Std. XI, helping them understand different subjects through activity-based learning, discussions, and guidance. These sessions aimed to improve the academic confidence and engagement of school children. Additionally, a Constructive Critique Session was conducted for the volunteers to encourage open communication, self-reflection, and mutual feedback in a respectful environment. This activity helped participants develop emotional maturity, empathy, and stronger interpersonal relationships. 153 volunteers participated, benefitting approximately 540 students.

### **Day 4 – 9 January 2026**

Several community outreach and awareness activities were conducted on this day. A Sickle Cell Detection Camp and CBC Testing Camp for girls from Std. V to VIII was organized at ZP School, Brahman Pada, Kosbad, in collaboration with PHC Gholvad. Another Sickle Cell Screening Camp was conducted for the residents of Dalvi Pada in collaboration with PHC Ashagad to promote early detection and awareness of Sickle Cell Anaemia. NSS volunteers also conducted a socio-economic survey across six padas to identify deserving beneficiaries for the distribution of Annaj Dan Coupons. In addition, Mr. Sachin Arekar, Police Havaldar from Gholvad Police Station, delivered a guest lecture on “Cyber Crimes and Frauds,” creating awareness about online safety and preventive measures. 153 volunteers participated, benefitting approximately 276 individuals.

### **Day 5 – 10 January 2026**

A Mega Donation Camp was organized in collaboration with the Lions Club of Malad Borivali, Leo Club of Malad Borivali – Dalmia Lions College, and the NSS Unit of Prahladrai Dalmia Lions College. Several initiatives were conducted, including Mattress Distribution, Annaj Dan Drive, Sanitary Napkin Distribution, Notebooks and Pens Distribution (Ek Kitab Ek Kalam Drive), Bicycle Distribution, and the installation of a Water Purifier to ensure access to safe drinking water. The event also featured a vibrant Tarpa Dance performance by D.Ed. College students, highlighting the cultural heritage of the tribal community. The speakers emphasized that NSS is a platform for developing empathy, discipline, and social responsibility. An awareness session on Nasha Mukti (De-addiction) was conducted by Ms. Disha Kalambe from Nasha Bandi Mandal, and a Warli Painting session introduced volunteers to traditional tribal art. An Appreciation Session was also organized to recognize teamwork among volunteers. 153 volunteers participated, and approximately 1200 beneficiaries were served.

### **Day 6 – 11 January 2026**

The day began with the Swachhta Hi Seva cleanliness drive, where volunteers actively participated in cleaning activities and promoted awareness about hygiene and environmental responsibility. A session on Village Mapping was conducted by Mr. Santosh Mekale from YCMOU, providing insights into identifying village resources, infrastructure, and developmental needs. A Feedback Session was also organized where students and teachers reflected on their experiences and learning during the camp. The day concluded with a Cultural Evening featuring shayari, dance, singing, and a bonfire, strengthening camaraderie among volunteers. 153 volunteers participated, benefitting 153 individuals.

**Day 7 – 12 January 2026**

On the final day, NSS volunteers celebrated International Youth Day by performing street plays to spread awareness about various social issues and to highlight the role of youth in bringing positive social change. The performances attracted the attention of the local community and effectively communicated messages related to social responsibility and community development. 153 volunteers participated, benefitting around 250 people.
