Department of Life Long Learning and Extension (DLLE)

The Department of Life Long Learning & Extension (DLLE) formerly known as the Department of Adult & Continuing Education & Extension (DACEE) has been recognized as a Statutory Department of the University of Mumbai since 1994. It aims to promote a sustained rapport between the University and the community. The Extension dimension of the Department facilitates the sensitization of the students to the socio-cultural realities. The department offers extension work projects encompassing social issues to the students.

The Department of Life Long Learning & Extension (DLLE) of our college started the enrollment of students from the month of June and it enrolled a total of 328 students for the academic year 2013-14.

The Department is spearheaded by Ms. Shami Nimqulkar-Kamble (Economics Department) and three most enthusiastic teachers: Mr. Mahendra Pachadkar (Commerce Department), Mr. Nishit Dave (Accountancy Department) and Mr. Sandeep Gupta (Mathematics and Statistics Department). To ensure efficiency in the execution of the extension work and to assist the teachers in the work involved, the extension activity of the Student Managers was felt pivotal. The pillars of the department (Student Managers) were: Ms. Devika Bhandari, Mr. Suresh Kannojiya, Mr. Devang Kothari, Mr. Vishal Chouhan, Mr. Mohit Chauhan, Mr. Praful Jain, Mr. Navratna Lohia, Mr. Nitin Goyal Ms. Renu Gupta and Ms. Diana H. The Department was inaugurated at the hands of Dr. Sujata Dhopte, Assistant Professor, M.K.Sanghvi College and our field co-ordinator and Principal Dr. N.N. Pandey.

The Department this year enrolled students under two different extension work projects:

Survey of Women's Status (SWS): The purpose of this project is to sensitise the students about the problems faced by women and to generate a sense of realization among students to be a contributory factor towards their empowerment. Our students conducted a survey of women in the age group of 15–35 years. They interviewed 25 to 50 women each in the areas chosen under the project.

National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS): The purpose of the project is to create awareness about the concept of Open Schooling among the public at large. We conducted college level activity in the month of October for an entire week. Students from TYBCom, TYBMS and MCom Part I prepared power point presentations and

posters on various aspects of NIOS such as Need for NIOS, NIOS models in India, eligibility criteria for NIOS, admission procedure under NIOS, study material for NIOS, regional centres for NIOS and so on. There were 24 groups of 10 students each who presented these topics through power point presentations. 27 posters were made by these group members on NIOS. The Department always recognizes the hard work that students put in. It is because of their consistent support and perseverance, that our unit has gained glory at the University level. The Department felicitated students by announcing 3 categories of prizes – Best PPTS, Best Posters and Best Speakers.

As far as Community level activities are concerned, we took our extension students to Malad Municipal School, New Era, Malad (W). Our extension students delivered lectures on various aspects of NIOS for 30 minutes to school children from Std V to Std X. Some of our students also conducted as survey of slums / chawls and identified the school dropouts. They created awareness about NIOS among them.

These projects thus provide a forum for exchange of ideas, innovations, amassing knowledge and provides a chance to increase the representative voice of those traditionally under-served and ignored in society.

The Extension work teachers attended the First Term Training Programme at Thakur College on 4th September 2013 and the Second Term Training Programme at Vidyarthi Vidyapeeth Bhavan, Churchgate on 5th December 2013.

Our Field Coordinator Dr. Sujata Dhopte addressed and guided our extension students in both the terms. Her valuable guidance helped the students in completing their project work. As a part of the project work, students have also written essays of about 1500 words each on an array of social issues.

We are proud to state that our college won the First prize at inter-collegiate skit competition—UDAAN — 'A Flight to Extension' organized by the Department of Lifelong Learning & Extension (DLLE), University of Mumbai on 21th January 2014 at Ghanshyamdas Saraf College, Malad. Our skit titled: *Stree Purush Samanta*, performed at the UDAAN festival conveyed a strong social message of gender sensitization. Our Drama Director- Mr. Rahul Balekundri was the driving force in polishing the acting skills of our budding extension actors. Our extension work actors — Mr. Suresh Kannojiya, Ms. Renu Gupta , Ms. Diana H., Mr. Rajeev Maroo, Mr. Suryabhushan Mishra, Mr. Harkalwalsingh Chopra, Mr. Navratna Lohia, Mr. Vishal
