
- 1. Difficulty Level of the course

Following is a graphical representation of the ratings accorded by the respondents:


### 1. Difficulty Level of the course

163 Respondents' response was analyzed and the data emerged as under: 45.40 % of Respondents asserted that the syllabus was Challenging while 41.10% indicated that it was dull, 4.29 % found it was Adequate and 9.20 % said it is Inadequate.




## 2. Balance between Practical and Theory


### 4. Contribute towards inculcating of ethics, values and moral sense


## 6. Simulating extra learning and self-learning

145 Respondents' response was analyzed and the data emerged as under: 40% of Respondents asserted that there internal assessment is useful while 60% indicated that it is not.



# 1. Difficulty Level of the course



## 2. Balance between Practical and Theory




## 4. Contribute towards inculcating of ethics, values and moral sense


## 6. Simulating extra learning and self-learning


## 1. Difficulty Level of the course


### 2. Balance between Practical and Theory

## 4. Contribute towards inculcating of ethics, values and moral sense


23 Respondents' response was analyzed and the data emerged as under:


## 5. Employability enhancing content

- 42.86% of Respondents asserted that the syllabus has Employability enhancing content while 14.29% indicated that it was not, 42.86% found it was up to some extent.




## 6. Simulating extra learning and self-learning




## 1. Difficulty Level of the course

### 2. Balance between Practical and Theory



extent.




## 4. Contribute towards inculcating of ethics, values and moral sense


## 5. Employability enhancing content
