REPORT OF NSS ACTIVITIES FOR THE YEAR 2024-25

The NSS unit actively participated in various social and environmental initiatives, fostering awareness, leadership, and community engagement among students. The activities conducted are as follows:

1) Date: 14-07-2024

Activity: "Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam" & Cleanliness Drive at Loknete Gopinath Munde Ground, Dahisar West

This initiative emphasized environmental awareness and social responsibility. NSS volunteers planted trees and participated in a cleanliness drive, enhancing their teamwork and leadership skills.

2) Date: 17-07-2024

Activity: "Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam" at Advocate Desai Ground, Mahim West, Mumbai

Continuing the environmental initiative, NSS volunteers engaged in tree planting and awareness campaigns. The activity strengthened their commitment to sustainability and cleanliness.

3) Date: 23-07-2024

Activity: RRC Peer Educator Programme

Through this program, NSS volunteers were trained to educate their peers on crucial health issues such as HIV/AIDS, substance abuse, and overall well-being. This initiative aimed to reduce stigma, spread awareness, and promote healthier lifestyles through informed and responsible behaviour.

4) Date: 23-07-2024

Activity: Intercollegiate Poster Making Competition at Vivek College, Goregaon West, Mumbai

This competition provided NSS volunteers with a platform to express social issues creatively. It enhanced their teamwork, artistic skills, and awareness while visually communicating important messages to the community. The event encouraged positive social change through impactful visual storytelling. Our first year NSS volunteer- Ms Ketki Jadhav won the First Prize in Poster Making Competition.



5) Date: 01-08-2024

Activity: Inauguration of RRC & NSS Orientation Programme

The orientation programme introduced NSS volunteers to the significance of social service, health awareness, and leadership. A special focus was on educating them about HIV/AIDS prevention, reducing stigma, and promoting hygiene and well-being. The session also equipped volunteers with essential skills like teamwork and problem-solving, fostering a commitment to community service and positive social change. Dr. Vivek Choubey, our NSS Area Co-ordinator graced the occasion with his presence. We also had Dr. Rajesh Bombe, former NSS P.O and former Area Co-ordinator to guide students.

6) Date: 07-08-2024

Activity: Cyber Jagrookta Diwas

This initiative aimed at raising awareness about cybersecurity and online safety. NSS volunteers learned about cyber threats, responsible digital behaviour, and preventive measures against cybercrimes. The programme empowered them to educate others, ensuring a safer digital environment for the community. The resource person invited for this programme was Mr. Sachin Dedhia, an ethical hacker who gave live examples and explained to the students the nuances of cyber threats and cyber security. We were fortunate to have amidst us Mr. Sushil Shinde, OSD, NSS Cell, University of Mumbai as the chief guest for the programme who guided the students and explained the role of the NSS volunteer.

7) Date: 10-08-2024

Activity: "Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam" – Gagangaon, Talasari Dahanu

This tree plantation drive promoted environmental awareness and sustainability among NSS volunteers. By planting trees, participants contributed to improving air quality and fostering a culture of ecological responsibility within the community.

8) Date: 12-08-2024

9) Date: 13-08-2024

Activity: Flash Mob on HIV/AIDS Awareness at Malad Depot, Appa Pada, Ambedkar Nagar, Lokhandwala, Kandivali East.

Through an engaging and interactive performance, NSS volunteers raised awareness about HIV/AIDS, emphasizing prevention, reducing stigma, and promoting safe health practices. The flash mob effectively captured public attention, making the message accessible and memorable.

10) Date: 01-08-2024 to 14-08-2024

Activity: "Ek Muthi Anaj" – Food Donation Drive

Over 14 days, NSS volunteers conducted a dedicated campaign within the college, motivating students to contribute towards the cause. Their relentless efforts resulted in the successful collection of 1,000 kgs of food grains, showcasing the power of collective action and social responsibility.

11) Date: 14-08-2024

Activity: Rally for Har Ghar Tiranga

NSS volunteers organized a rally to instill patriotism and encourage citizens to proudly display the national flag at their homes. The initiative aimed to spread awareness about the significance of the Tricolor, promote unity, and strengthen the spirit of nationalism through active community participation.

12) Date: 15-08-2024

Activity: Annaj Dan and Independence Day – Flag Hoisting

The flag hoisting ceremony was conducted to honor the sacrifices of freedom fighters and celebrate national sovereignty. The event instilled a sense of patriotism, unity, and respect for the national flag while encouraging civic responsibility and a commitment to the nation's progress. Also the 1000 kgs of foodgrains we collected was donated to an NGO that works for the visually impaired on the said day.



13) Date: 20-08-2024

Activity: Door-to-Door Awareness on Voter Registration – Importance of Voting

On the first day, NSS volunteers visited residential houses in Sunder Nagar and Prem Nagar and emphasized the importance of voting in a democracy. They explained how each vote contributes to shaping the nation's future and why active citizen participation is crucial. Volunteers also shared information on voter eligibility criteria and how first-time voters can register.

14) Date: 21-08-2024

Activity: Door-to-Door Awareness on Voter Registration – Registration Process

The second day focused on educating people about the step-by-step process of voter registration. Volunteers guided citizens on where and how to register, the documents required, and how to check their names in the electoral roll. They also assisted individuals in filling out registration forms to make the process easier.
