DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS LAW REPORT OF COURT VISIT. ON 5th April. 2018

Date: 6th April, 2018

The purpose of the visit was to understand the working of a court, the nature of duties of the judicial officers. The visit was to help the student in understanding the role of court in dispensing justice in any case, the role of prosecutors in a case, the way cases proceed in a court, the way judges, prosecutors and defence lawyers handle the case, the relationship of the prosecutors and the police. This gave an opportunity to understand the actual need of co- ordination in the justice system. The visit included an in-depth study of the day to day functioning of the Civil and Criminal Courts, at different levels and over a vast variety of cases including corporate matters.

The aim was to evaluate the resources available and the distribution of power between the judges, the prosecution, and the defence council.

51 students of S.Y.BCom visited the Bombay High Court, on 5th April ,2018. The students were accompanied by Dr. Mahendra Pachadkar Assistant Professor- Department of Business Law

The visit was permitted by Registrar Bombay High Court, which was obtained by Dr. Mahendra Pachadkar The day started with a brief note given to the students about the Court and court rooms by Advocate Satish Shinde who is practicing Advocate at Bombay High Court, He guided all the students and dictated the Jurisdiction of the different courts. Here students are got an insight into the manner in which proceedings were conducted, Criminal, Corporate and Civil matters.

The Feedback given by students indicated that students had the curiosity of court proceedings which they have seen in presence and acquired the basic knowledge about the court and judicial system.
