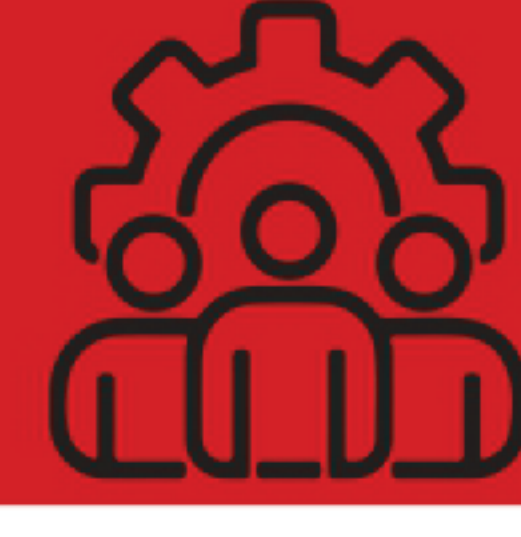

Triumph Tale: Navigating Success Across Various Competitions

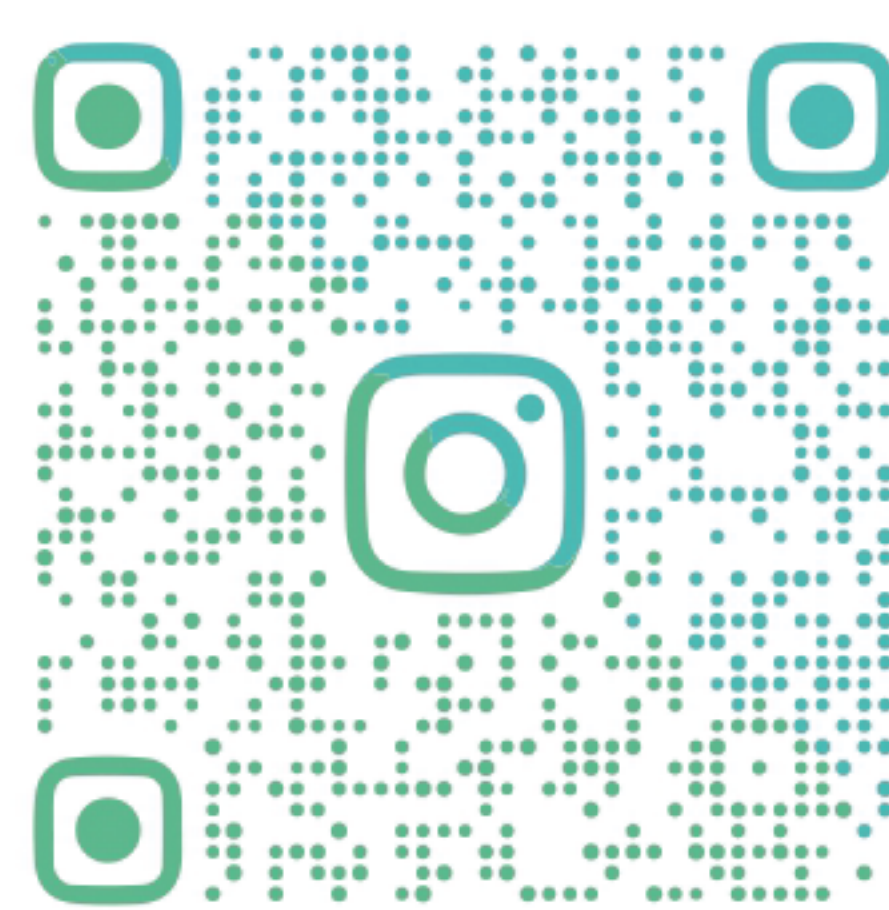
