She was very good with her academics and extracurricular activities, she was in a convent boy's school because of which she often felt that she was different, it was hard for her to relate with the people around her at school, the femininity in her was struggling to be out there but she was not sure of the repercussions.

Life took a turn when her father had to shift to Mumbai, the city of dreams. She thought that the city of dreams could even help in fulfilling hers. Being a girl trapped inside a boy's body, it was hard to bear and she took a leap of faith and left her home, she left the home and came in contact with the 'HUMSAFAR TRUST', where she worked for the welfare of the LGBT community. She was ignited with a spark to work and do something in the field of the gender equality.



Proceeding further, she founded Sakhi Char Chowghi trust in 2000. The NGO promotes safe sex and provides counselling to transgender people.

An incident inspired her when a 4 year old girl was left alone after the death of her mother due to AIDS. She felt this remorse so deeply which made her feel that she must do something about it. She adopted the girl. This incident motivated her to file a petition in the Supreme Court for the adoption rights for transgender people. She was a petitioner in the national legal services authority (NALSA) case in granting transgender as third gender.

From an ordinary boy, she was now a renewed legendary personality who was featured by the Vicks ads also. Ms. Gauri Sawant has created history with golden words in all over the world.

We are 7.7 billion humans living on only one planet generating tremendous amount of waste which if not treated properly will cause non-reversible problems. Earth itself promotes producing waste and treatment of that waste by itself which helps maintain the biological cycle. Humans generates approximately 572 billion tons of solid waste per year which is equal to ¼ of the earth's mass. Waste has always been a burning issue, in these times treatment of such waste and management skills are mandatory.

There are basically two main streams in which wastes is classified: Degradable waste. 2. Non degradable waste.

1. DEGRADABLE WASTE: The waste composition which can be easily broken into its smaller components, which can replenish the ecosystem to continue the chain of biological cycle is called as degradable waste. eg. Organic components such as food waste, peels of the fruits, dead living being and etc. This type of waste promotes the sustainability of environments, it is also useful for the well-being of the flora and fauna. Management of such waste can be done very easily and fruitfully anywhere in the surrounding as degradable materials require least maintenance.

2. NON-DEGRADABLE WASTE: The waste composition which cannot be easily broken into its smaller components, such waste are called as non-degradable waste. Such type of waste are extremely dangerous and is a threat to the environment eg: plastic, polythene heavy metals, and radioactive elements. Such types of wastes do not decompose easily and stays in the ecosystem for many years and have an adverse impact on the ecosystem. Managing such type is waste is essential for the conservation and preservation of the flora and fauna. One should definitely avoid using such materials which directly or indirectly pollutes the environment. As far as waste management is concerned we all must work on personal levels to curb it out and take a pledge to not pollute our planet on any level. ## How Education Can Empower Women To Say No To Early Marriage?

In today's era, women empowerment is immensely important not just for women, but also for the development of country and society in every possible way. Do you know India is the most dangerous country for women on this globe! As India is a patriarchal country with almost 50% of female population and if given chance will surely contribute tremendously for development and growth of the country. But India being the one with old traditions and beliefs grounded with their sick mentality cannot get over to the fact that women are as equal as men and hence are not encouraged for education. We are in the 21st century where the entire world is developing with each passing second. But when in case of girls, are they given equal rights to choose their and prioritize their preference? As moon too has a darker side, so does our society. Early marriage is one such dark side of the society. We go to schools, we learn, we opt for higher education, but there are still some girls who don't even know what school means or what learning is. They grow up learning that they are girls and girls are made for kitchen. They started believing that their purpose in life is to get married and serve others. In every country, the minimum age for getting married for a girl is 18 years. But, 60% of the marriages take place before the bride even reaches 16 years of age. The reason behind these early marriages is either poverty or stereo typical thinking. In many countries, still people believe that having a girl child is a curse and burden, they should not be sent to school or allowed to have a better life, and rather they must be get married soon. Due to early marriages girls suffer from unexpected and early pregnancy which is dangerous for a young girl. Carrying a baby at the age of 13-16 is not medically advisable. They face a lot of problem during their pregnancy and some of them end up having complicated diseases and some even lose

their lives. Girls with no education are 3 times as likely to marry by or even before the age of 18 as those with secondary or higher education. When a girl gets married, she is often expected to drop out of school. When a girl is out of school, she becomes more vulnerable to child marriage. Returning to school can be difficult for married girls. Girls who live far or have children to look after may not be able to resume their education.

Education is a powerful strategy to end early marriage. When girls have access to safe, quality education, the benefits are widely felt. Educated girls develop skills, knowledge and confidence to make informed decisions including if, when and whom to marry. But education alone is not enough to end child marriages. We need to address the root cause of child marriage: gender inequality, poverty, insecurity and the lack of economic and social opportunities for girls. There are a bunch of laws against the early marriages of women in every country. Unfortunately, the rate of early marriage was rapidly increasing across the globe because many of the cases were left untouched by the authorities and India was the highest rated among these. According to the latest research of 2011, census it has been decreasing from 27% to 7% although there is a great decrement in the rate but still there is this 7% which indicates that there are still existing early marriages and to remove this whole practice completely along with education, government should pay proper attention to these crimes, there should be strict laws and it is important to spread awareness about such issues in grass root level of rural and remote areas. Girls can make better future if they are properly guided. Do not spoil a bright future just because you are over powered by old traditional beliefs and customs.
